Save the Oregon State Library!

Oregon Governor John Kitzhaber's 2013-15 Budget included a major reorganization of the Oregon State Library, proposing to "1) eliminate Government Research Services; 2) consolidate the State Library's documents repository and reference services with the State Archives; and 3) reduce the costs ...by implementing improvements that were identified by the 2011 Workgroup on Libraries and Archives..."

In addition the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) has been working on the transformation. On October 25, 2013 Senator Steiner Hayward and Representative Nathanson of the Joint Ways and Means Committee, Subcommittee on General Government, provided an outline for the transformation. Concerning historical, cultural, and genealogical materials that would not typically be used for research for state agencies the report says:

- 1)Oregon Genealogy: This function will fully shift to the Oregon Historical Society. OHS should then determine the best method of collaborating with outside genealogical groups, such as the Willamette Valley Genealogical Society; 2)State Documents: All required state documents will be consolidated with the Archives and any materials that are not government records and should be kept for historical purposes will then be moved to the Oregon Historical Society;
- 3) State History: Similar to the State Documents, all required state documents will be consolidated with the Archives and any materials that are not government records and should be kept for historical purposes will then be moved to the Oregon Historical Society.

What does this mean to historians, genealogists, researchers and Oregonians interested in history and culture?

* Oregon State Library currently has unique collections of Oregon history and culture, federal documents and collections, family histories, archives and books purchased years ago by the OSL such as a complete set of Massachusetts Vital Records, and Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's collection of family histories, genealogical materials for the US and other countries,

periodicals, CDs and volunteer help. All of this will be dismantled.

- * Limited access for research.
- What does this mean to Oregon taxpayers?
- * The Oregon State Archives and Oregon Historical Society do not have room for these materials. Money will have to be budgeted for moving and new spaces.
- * The Oregon Historical Society is a private organization, which charges a fee. The Oregon State Library materials were purchased with taxpayer money or donated with the understanding that materials would be available to the public.
- * DAS has not provided a financial cost analysis.
- * Funding for the State Library can be restructured to include general fund money, rather than assessing other state agencies. It's not necessary to dismantle Oregon's state library.

#### **WE REMEMBER**

"Thomas Vaughan was born in 1924 and died on December 6, 2013 at 89. When thinking of Thomas Vaughan, one thinks of the Oregon Historical Society and an exceptional researcher-author. Vaughan was the Executive Director of the Oregon Historical Society from 1954 through 1989. OHS had five employees and a budget of \$50,000 when he started and grew to 100 employees and a budget of \$4,500,000 when he retired. Exhibit areas were expanded attracting many more visitors annually. Neighboring buildings were purchased to complete a full Portland city block for the Oregon History Center. He worked with the state legislatures to get state funding for OHS, but that funding decreased significantly in the 1990s and more recently.

"He is known for his leadership on the Oregon Geographic Names Board and helping Portland State University established a Public History Program, to train students for a career in history. He encouraged assistance with museums and county, city, and other historical groups. In 2006 the Thomas Vaughan Gallery was dedicated in the Oregon History Center in Portland.

Northwest History with Priscilla Knuth, Portland A Historical Sketch and Guide with Terence O'Donnell. He Edited The Western Shore: Oregon Country Essays as well as High & Mighty: Selected Sketches about the Deschutes County and wrote Voyages of Enlightenment: Malaspina on the Northwest Coast 1791- 1792 with E. A. P. Crownhart-Vaughan, Mercedes Palau de Iglesias."
