President's Note

Saturday, October 19, 2013 – Philip Foster Farm tour and Board Meeting

Sunshine and a pioneer family greeted SDOP members at the Philip Foster Farm, a National Historic Site, located at the end of the Barlow Trail. Philip Foster and his family arrived in Oregon by ship in 1843. When Sam Barlow arrived in Oregon in 1845, the two men entered into a partnership to develop a road around Mt. Hood. The road became known as the Barlow Road. The Fosters moved to Eagle Creek from Oregon City in 1847 to help maintain the road and their home became a resting spot for the pioneers after the terrible trip over Mt. Hood. The board meeting took place at Cazadero Inn in Estacada. We had a great turn out for both the tour and the SDOP board meeting.

SDOP roots go back to 1875 when the original pioneers would have reunions which resulted in the establishment of the Oregon Pioneer Association. In 1897 this group took on the name of Sons and Daughters of Oregon Pioneers (SDOP) since many of the original pioneers were beginning to die and their children wanted to keep the Oregon Pioneer Spirit alive. SDOP was incorporated in 1901. Not many organizations have such a long history. SDOP remains financially stable but it became apparent during the SDOP Board meeting on October 19, 2013 and the review/approval of the budget for SDOP through June 30, 2014 that the cost of mailing and printing the newsletters is putting a financial drain on SDOP. If you can received the SDOP Newsletter via email it would help reduce our costs. Plus when receiving the newsletter by email you'll receive a wonderful color version. Please see the enclosed flyer on this subject. The next SDOP meeting is January 11, 2014 from 10:30 AM – 12:00 PM. We hope to be done with the business part of the meeting around noon so we can enjoy lunch together. This meeting is a Potluck at my house. All members are invited. We'll be putting the final plans together for our annual Oregon Birthday banquet to be held February 16, 2014 at the Monarch Hotel in Clackamas, Oregon.

October Meeting Held in Estacada

Members of SDOP enjoyed a tour of the historic Philip Foster Farm in Eagle Creek. It was followed by lunch and the meeting at the Cazadero Inn in Estacada. Twenty-two members and guests attended the meeting.

The Secretary's and President's reports were given. Chris Meinicke clarified and apologized for the confusion regarding newsletters and the possibility of increased costs of printed copies. She stated that the insert sent in the emailed newsletter will be revised and sent in all newsletters in November.

Treasurer Mary Laws gave the Treasurer's Report. She also presented the Budget Report. It reflects a financial need in SDOP. The main expense is the newsletter. Options for adding revenue were discussed. Discussion was held on withdrawing some of the interest from the Blackerby gift to help fund this year's expenses. A motion passed on removing part of the Blackerby account interest for expenses this year. The budget was approved. Discussion was held on increasing the life membership amount. Finance committee will meet in November to discuss other revenue options.

President-Elect Drew Ackerlund asked for banquet speaker suggestions. The Monarch Hotel has been reserved.

Merle Miller reported on membership. There are nine new life members and 11 regular members who have changed to life members. Discussion was held on the history of the web page.

Mel Fuller presented the Roster Committee report. He presented a detailed power point presentation on the database he has developed. Cleve Parker recommended that it be accessible in an internet cloud or drop box. Discussion was held on the new reasonably priced computer for Merle.

Maryjane Davey reported on the committee for scholarships, junior awards and Miss Pioneer Oregon. Contests will remain within budget parameters.

Marsha Ackerlund noted that we need more information on design, quantity, etc. for SDOP fund raising items in her Marketing and Fundraising Committee report. Diane Root passed out the new SDOP brochure with the new revisions. Cleve suggested putting our new brochure in as many historical societies and museums around the State of Oregon and State of Washington for marketing and membership outreach.

Under New Business, Drew spoke on benefits to our organization of endowments, donations from wills and other sources. He suggested ideas like a "Pioneer Package" offered to families who wish to join SDOP.

Meeting was adjourned.

Miss Pioneer Oregon 2014

Applications are now being accepted for Miss Pioneer Oregon 2013. Here is an opportunity for young women with Oregon pioneer ancestry to be selected as an official representative of Sons and Daughters of Oregon Pioneers. The successful candidate is rewarded with the honor of being selected and monetary benefits.

Requirements:

- 1. Open to any single woman, age 16 21, who is eligible for membership in SDOP as a direct descendant of an Oregon pioneer. The pioneer ancestor must have arrived and settled in the Oregon Territory before statehood, Feb. 14, 1859.
- 2. If selected, she is required to attend the SDOP Annual Statehood Banquet in February and give a five minute speech on Oregon history or her pioneer heritage. She also is required to attend the annual SDOP picnic in July.
- 3. Unless unavoidable conflicts exist, she is expected to attend the Founders' Day celebration at Champoeg State Park in May and the SDOP annual meeting in June. She may also volunteer to take part in festivals, celebrations, fairs, and parades sponsored by other organizations.
- 4. She is required to appear at all official functions in pioneer costume with the special "Miss Pioneer Oregon" sash furnished by SDOP.
- 5. She is required to have a studio portrait made for programs and publicity purposes. Two 8x10 portraits will be paid by SDOP (up to \$100) with one copy given to Miss Pioneer Oregon. The newsletter/banquet portrait needs to be sent electronically to Jake Root at jdrooter@yahoo.com .
