President's Report -

Annual Banquet: Sat. Feb. 16, at the Monarch Hotel in the Grand Ballroom. Our speaker, Wendell Baskins will speak on the Barlow Road. He has asked that his \$100.00 fee go to the Rose House in Oregon City. She has checked with Sons of the Oregon Revolution for color guard.

Committee Reports:

Digital Archive Report - Forensic IT report given by Don Limbaugh who works as a lead software developer for Brynka with presentation by both Don & Cleve of no cost digital archive alternative.

Option 1: product called Omeka, a web publishing platform that is specifically designed for digital archives. The cost is Free.

Option 2: Keeping Caspio, 5 GB of total storage for purpose of pricing: \$186.10 per month.

Don's recommendations: few ways to combine the 2 options. Go with Omeka and use the State of Oregon site to do pioneer lookups. Could also go with straight Caspio, pay the cost. Could do a hybrid of Caspio and Omeka that only makes use of some Caspio pages with links to Omeka searching.

Cleve walked the board through the archives that have been posted on our website.

Board discussion – There was a discussion regarding Caspio and database options including Omeka.

Motion- Joy made a motion to reinstate Mel Fuller to his board position and as technology chairman. Chris 2nd. Motion passed. Need to determine level of reimbursement for Mel.

Finance Budget Committee Report – Cleve and Dave; We have a balanced budget for next year. Found several line items that were being budgeted for twice. There is an increased expense in newsletters, since we added an extra issue. We had cut the Echo donation by \$50.00 pending the new budget. It was suggested we give a donation of another \$50.00 to match what we usually give to museums. Chris made

a motion to give another \$50 to The City of Echo. Joy 2nd the motion. Motion passed.

Events & Correspondence Sec – There has been a big packet of letters that have been given to the planning committee. People came to the last meeting and gave personal talks. There will be another meeting and a new proposal.

Cleve gave a letter of resignation as Treasurer and as Web Master.
