FINDING IRA HOOKER

We stopped at one of the trailer houses to see if someone might be able to direct us to the cemetery. I got out and knocked and knocked and knocked on the door. Finally, a lady appeared. She had no idea where the Montgomery Cemetery was, but she thought there was some kind of pioneer cemetery at a little country church a mile or so down the road. We headed down the road. We found a lovely little country church, but no cemetery anywhere in sight. We drove up and down the road both ways, but no luck. We may as well give this search up.

We turned around and headed back the way we had come. A few blocks down the road we passed a street sign for "Ira Hooker Road". Now Ira Hooker was my fourth great grandfather. There was a house on the corner. My wife insisted that we should stop and ask something, anything! I made sure she knew that I was not going to knock on any more doors! Period! But, that's why they sent a woman to the moon – they needed someone who was not shy about asking for directions! I pulled up to the little frame house and my wife got out and knocked on the screen door that was in front of an open doorway. A squeaky little voice

replied "Come In." My wife opened the door to an ancient little lady who was delighted to see us.

When questioned about Ira Hooker, the lady, whose name was Alberta, said she had heard her mother mention that name before, but really didn't know any Hookers. She then told my wife who her mother was. No Luck. And who her grandmother was. Score! My wife recognized the name of her grandmother. She stuck her head out the door and told me to turn the car engine off and come in. We had hit pay dirt. Turns out, Alberta's grandmother was a sister to my great grandmother, and she was my second cousin, once removed. She invited us right in, and we told her our lost cemetery saga. She knew right where that cemetery was and would even take us there, which she did. It is located several hundred yards on the other side of the stand of trees that GPS had led us to. And Alberta is the person to call when someone wants to be buried there. She has even replaced all the old unreadable grave markers with new markers which she has hand made

Alberta also took us to the other pioneer cemetery "by the church" that we had heard of and could not find. Turns out, you have to take a turn on the road just past the church and drive to the top of the mountain to get to the cemetery! That explains why we could not see it sitting in the front of the church.

We had a lovely visit with Alberta and heard all kinds of family stories. Alberta knew everyone in the community, including many of my own ancestors.

The following year, in 2015, we made another trip to Oregon and Washington state. On that visit we made a specific detour to Pedee to see Alberta. She was just as delighted to see us again. Said she had been thinking about us. You would have thought we had just been there the week before. We were always full of questions for her, since she had lived in Polk County all her life. This little 80some-odd-year old woman went upstairs in her house and lugged down a huge box of photos and we spent the afternoon with her going through photos, listening to her stories about all the people and scanning pictures. One of the treasures we came away with, other than getting to know Alberta, was a family photo that included my great, great grandmother Sarah Catherine Hooker whose family crossed the plains from Indiana to settle in the Willamette Valley in 1848.

SDOP Board Meeting Clackamas Town Center November 16, 2019

Dave called the meeting to order at 10:17 am.

Board Present: Reggie Burke, Janet Wilson, Dave Thompson, Joy Eaton, Priscilla Belin, Chris Meineke, Karyn Verstrate, Mel Fuller and Dawn Alexander. Members: Brain Dueltgen and Friends: Terry Thompson, Julia Wilson, Paul Verstrate

Officers' Reports:

Secretary: Dawn read the September meeting minutes; motion by Chris to accept, Joy E. 2nd. Motion passed.

President: Dave suggests an extra banquet mailing in Dec since last newsletter didn't have room. Working on Color brochure; if anyone wants to help please let Dave know. Dave mentioned you can see if you are getting newsletter electronically or by mail in the members only section on the website.

Treasurer: Mel gave the treasurer's report. We have 65 members with outstanding dues; Mel will turn off access to My Oregon Territory for those members who haven't paid by the end of the year. Mel can make and mail a hard copy member list for \$10.00. Motion by Mel to offer Merle the filing cabinet in exchange for expenses incurred as Registrar; Priscilla 2nd, Motion passed. Mel will let him know. Motion by Chris to accept treasurers report. Joy 2nd the motion. Motion passed.

President Elect: Joy reported that Barbara Roberts will be our banquet speaker. Joy will try to get Gerry Frank for the picnic or the 2021 banquet. Banquet room cost is

\$2400, up from \$1800 for 80-100 people. Joy recommends we keep the adult price at \$35.00. Adults are age 12+. Children ages 4-11 were \$25 last year. The flute players we had at the picnic will be playing at the banquet. Dave's grandson's a Boy Scout so will check with them for color guard. Will send invitations to the usual dignitaries. Do we want to do a silent auction again? Terry will help with that... Janet has some things she'll bring. Will put a notice in the January newsletter seeking donations for it.

Committee Reports:

Nominations committee: New board members Reggie and Karyn. Brian Dueltgen is considering joining. Mel mentioned that we need a wagon master for the Rose Parade. We also need a president elect.

Information Technology Committee: Mel went over the Online Application process. 1st step to become a member - fill in the online form, click on all authorizations and pay dues. Mel and Priscilla get a notice that dues have been paid. New member goes back to form and fills in personal information which is secure on our members only site. An email is then sent to the new member to validate their information, and is used by the Registrar for research. Priscilla then changes the status from pending to active. Mel also sends an email so the member knows they can go to the members only section of the website and edit their own profiles. For Priscilla to deal with issues, we should get a data page so she can search data about members... change pending to active and make any changes for members that can't go in and edit their own information. Cost \$8.00/month to do this. Motion by Mel to authorize the additional \$96.00 a year for the additional data page for researching, and 2 links on the Join Us page for 'new' and 'update,' then evaluate in a year to see if we're getting money's worth. Chris 2nd, Motion passed. Discussed adding lines to the paper application so it is consistent with the online application. **Social media:** Janet reported we had 2,899 Facebook hits in one month! She's connecting with other museums and similar events, and getting new members there. Janet has sent scholarship and award forms to schools as far away as Estacada, and also to our parade contact. She has also been in touch with the Pacific Northwest History group (Réjean Beaulieu).

Events Committee: Chris reported our April 25th tour is booked at the Rose House in Oregon City. Wendell Baskins will be our guide. We'll tour 1st, at 10:30, with lunch and meeting after. Chris will check for meeting/lunch place.

Newsletter Editor: Chris noted that several people have mail returned. A list was printed in the last newsletter. She found one person on the list had passed away.

Awards and Scholarships Committee: Dawn mentioned some minor changes to the applications on where to send them. They are all due by Dec. 15th.

Cookbook development committee: Janet had made a mixed berry pie. Turned our really good. Pioneers did not put as much sugar in them, as very expensive. Janet will be giving a speaking engagement in Feb. and will be talking about SDOP and Pittock Mansion. Would like to have new brochures by then.

Correspondence Sec.: Chris mentioned a \$500.00 donation from Peter Scherwin and sent a thank you letter to him.

Trading Post: Reggie is open for business and open for new product suggestions. Her next new piece will be adding a monogram on one side of keychain.

Digitizing committee: Mel, Dave, Gary – Only one scanning party since last meeting. Only weekends since school has started. We are making progress, about 1/3 of the way through.

Public Relations: Joy gave a big thank you to Natalie and her family for all the publicity they've given to SDOP this year with all the events that Natalie has covered.

New Business:

- Dave made a motion to donate \$100.00 to Veritas for the use of the scanners. Joy 2nd, Motion passed.
- Discussion to make a policy that at the discretion of the treasurer give a complimentary life membership to anyone over 85. Dave made a motion to do so; Janet 2nd, Motion passed.
- Discussion about making friend dues the same as member renewals, and the ability to bestow a lifetime friend or life member on people who've made a contribution of time, service, and/or money at the discretion of the treasurer. Dave made a motion to do so; Joy 2nd, Motion passed.

Motion by Janet to adjourn; Mel 2nd, Motion passed. Meeting was adjourned at 1:00 pm.

GUEST SPEAKER: Barbara Roberts was elected Governor of Oregon in 1990, becoming the first woman governor in her state and one of the first ten women governors in the nation. Previously, she held public office for 24 years including as a ten-year school board member, community college board member, county commissioner, Oregon State Representative, and six years as Oregon Secretary of State.

A native Oregonian and descendant of 1853 Oregon Trail Pioneers, Roberts is a published author, active public speaker, mother of two grown sons, grandmother of two and step-grandmother of 16.

Over the past 40 years, Roberts has served on over 35 non-profit boards. She is currently serving on the Special Olympics of Oregon board. Among her many recognitions is the naming of the Department of Human Services Building in Salem in her honor, the Barbara Roberts High School in Salem, and honorary doctorate degrees from both Willamette and Portland State Universities. In 2014 the Oregon Historical Society named her an Oregon History Maker.
