



## **Ewing Young Day**

#### DID YOU KNOW:

In 2009, the Oregon State Legislation passed SB 625 which designated February 9<sup>th</sup> as Ewing Young Day. "Be it enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: Section 1. February 9 of each year shall be known as Ewing Young Day, to commemorate Ewing Young's contribution to the formation of Oregon's provision government and aid to the settlers of the Willamette Valley."

# WHY Celebrate on February 9<sup>th</sup>, the date of Ewing Young's death?

Mr. Ewing Young was an American Fur Trapper, cattleman, and trader from Tennessee. Mr. Young traded along the Santa Fe Trail and established new trails. He later settled in the west bank of the Willamette River, near the mouth of Chehalem Creek opposite Champoeg, Oregon.

In February 1841, Ewing Young died without any known heir and without a will. As a wealthy citizen of Oregon, this created a need for some form of Probate Court to deal with his estate. Doctor Ira L. Babcock was selected as supreme judge with probate powers to deal with Young's estate. This situation led to the creation of a provisional government in the Oregon Territory.

The Oregon Provisional government, formed in Champoeg on May 2, 1843, set the Oregon Territory on the path to statehood on February 14, 1859. The forming of Oregon Provisional Government is celebrated every year at Champoeg Park on the first Saturday in May.

The tenth anniversary celebration of "Ewing Young Day' at the Newberg Public Library was on Saturday, February 8, 2020 and was a success with about 50 community members in attendance to learn more about Ewing Young and his pioneer life. Some significant people showed up to celebrate Ewing Young Days including "Mr. Young" himself, (interpreted by Champoeg Park's own State Park's ranger Dan Klug) and "Dr. McLoughlin"



(interpreted by Will Worthey, Director of the Newberg Library)..

There were some other enthusiastic pioneers, including SDOP members and Newell Pioneer Village volunteers.

#### Meet the New Board Member

My name is Karyn Hesseltine Verstrate. At our Banquet in February, I was voted in, becoming your newest SDOP board member! I am very excited about being a part of such a great organization.

I was born in Ellensburg, Washington and have, also, lived in California, Massachusetts, & Montana. As a pre-teen, growing up in California, I explored my family tree – asking my parents and my three living grandparents about their past. I read and dreamt about being an Oregon Pioneer! However, I didn't uncover my Oregon Roots until just a few years ago.

Moving to our beautiful state in the 1970's, I worked as an Administrative Assistant for Lewis and Clark College and then for Portland Community College. I was, also

employed for a couple of years as a Professor's Assistant for a great program called OEMBA - an "Executive's Masters" consortium program with U of O, OSU, & PSU. A few years after my husband Paul Verstrate and I married we were blessed to adopt our two children! While they were young, I enjoyed being at home with our children and I appreciated being able to volunteer at their schools for about 16 years. Off and on through the years of our marriage, I worked for Paul's manufacturing business in Hillsboro. I am now retired!

With retirement, came a renewal to explore my family history!

My father, at eleven lost his father, Lindsay Maurice Hesseltine, from T.B. With the early passing of his father, a vast amount family history disappeared. However, his grandfather Oscar Hesseltine, born in Kansas in 1858 was a significant part of my dad's life. Oscar came west, in the 1860's, with his family and settled in Washington Territory. In 1881, he married Adna W. Johns. My parents had this information in our family bible. Oscar and Adna moved to California, where Adna died in 1912.

With just a nugget of the name Adna Johns, I began my search... It's amazing how many pieces of the puzzle can now be found on-line! Finding out that Adna was born, October 1858, in McMinnville, Oregon, took me on a short trip to Layfette, Oregon and a long journey into the past. The Yamhill Historical Society is where I discovered a thick file about the Nehemiah Martin family – Adna's Grandparents and my 3<sup>rd</sup> Greats. This file opened a wide window of information about my forefathers!

My Second Great Grandfather Isaiah Morris Johns, born 1821 in Ohio, traveled from Ohio to Kansas around 1844. Then, he joined a wagon train and came to Oregon in 1847. With his donated land claim, in Yamhill, Oregon Territory, Isaiah became a neighbor to the Nehemiah Martin family. In 1850 he married their oldest daughter Mary Sophia Martin. She was born 1833 in Cattaraugus, New York.

Her parents, Nehemiah Martin and Eliza Lois Middick married in Richfield, New York in 1827. Then, they slowly headed west. From Missouri they began their Oregon quest in 1843!

There is still so much to learn about my Oregon family – I feel that I've only touch the surface!

Continuing my pioneer search, I joined S.D.O.P. last Spring. It is a fantastic experience meeting other pioneer families!
