ters of Oregon [President Joyce del Rosario (*from len*)] Pioneers and many good friends gathered at the Museum of the Oregon Territory in Oregon City, Oregon for a lunch meal and guest speaker. SDOP is deeply honored that Kimberly Moreland, President of Oregon Black Pioneers, accepted our invitation to be the provide a keynote address to our diverse audience. Her topic "450 years of Black Pioneer History" inspired those in the room to keep discovering and expand access to our archives.

Coming out of the pandemic, banquet attendance was up nearly 150% from the prior year. Post-COVID banquet prices costs and ticket prices both increased, and SDOP did not break even. However, even more important than the financial performance of a single event, are the matters of the heart that were conveyed when we gathered. Many of the attendees shared a piece of their story that brought them to Oregon City 164 years after statehood. What a blessing to bestow on the fellow attendants! Connie- has a Grande Ronde connection who can provide info if we want. Suggests we look up the Story of Little Jane Johnson – Little girl who had been kidnapped, then rescued along the trail. Buried in the Oysterville Cemetery.
